OUR CARE

At Dunkirk Memorial House, our trained staff care for each resident as a unique individual. Everyone is treated with respect, dignity and freedom of choice, in an environment which may be regarded as home.

Every resident has a care plan to ensure that all their individuals care needs are met. Nursing clients also have a named nurse and all residents have keyworkers. Residents can register with a local GP surgery whose partners visit when required.

Everyone here is part of a big family. Our care assistants like to chat with and get to know the residents. Our younger assistants greatly value hearing the stories and perspectives of those who have done so much for their country. In return, residents are very appreciative of the personal care they receive.





OUR ACTIVITIES

Residents are encouraged to continue their hobbies, or even try out something new. For example, there is a monthly Luncheon Club, as well as visits to gardens and the coast. We also have indoor skittles, art and craft classes, armchair exercise sessions, social evenings in the bar, games of scrabble and cards, and books to borrow.

We have several spacious lounges where residents can socialise or sit quietly and read. The home has a delightful Chapel with regular services, and a memorial garden for Remembrance services and quiet reflection.

Located on the edge of Southam, a small market townin the Warwickshire countryside.

Set in Cromer, an attractive town on the North Norfolk coast.

Located in a quiet cul-de-sacin the coastal town of Bexhill-on-Sea, East Sussex.

Situated outside the coastal town of Broadstairs, Kent, with lovely sea views.

WHO CAN STAY?

The Royal British Legion has six care homes which provide short and long-term care for serving and ex-Service people and their dependants. Situated around the country, they offer a wide range of services including four with specialist dementia care.

Each home is registered with the Care Quality Commission, and has a Statement of Purpose and Resident Guide (available on request) which clearly define the care and services provided.

Our care home communities include men and women of varied ages and abilities. Our homes are exclusive to ex-Service people and their dependants, so there is always a special camaraderie.
